





✓ SENATE BILL 1716

Relating to a supplemental special education services and instructional materials program for certain public school students receiving special education services.

SB 1716 does:

✓ Provide needed extra services to help special education students recover from Covid-19 shutdown related learning loss

SB 1716 does not:

- Pay for private school tuition
- **✗** Go to private school students

What does the bill do?

- ★ Currently Texas operates a program called the Supplemental Special Education Services Program (SSES) with federal Covid-relief funding.
- ★ The program provides high-needs, special education families attending public school with \$1,500 to pay for supplemental services needed due to Covid-19 learning loss.
- ★ SB 1716 expands eligibility to include all children in special education in Texas public schools.
- ★ SB 1716 is for public school students who need **additional** special education services to **supplement** their public school instruction.
- ★ This fiscal note has been updated since the filed version and currently costs \$30 million per year.
- ★ The intent is to preserve the current program's funding structure, which we anticipate will utilize federal funds to pay for the program.
